



## Concerns: education, jobs, environment, accountability

June was another busy month. Your emails have been pouring in, and our phones are ringing off the hook. Thank you for sharing your ideas and concerns. It's important that I hear from you about how I can help make life easier for you and your family.

This month I have been out and about travelling in the constituency and around the province. During my travels I've heard a lot of concerns about education and affordability, as well as fears for our natural environment and anger over the BC Liberal government's lack of integrity.

For 12 years this government's cuts have made it harder to learn and harder to teach in our schools. Teachers have struggled to give our kids the best education and the best resources, but the BC Liberal government has failed to be a partner in making our schools better.

Twice, the BC Supreme Court has ruled that the government's actions on class size and composition were unconstitutional, and directed the government to resolve these issues at the bargaining table. The BC Liberal government refuses to comply.

As a result, teachers are now locked in a dispute with the government, and our

kids are locked out of their classrooms. My colleagues and I have joined teachers and parents calling for an independent mediator to step in and help reach an agreement that puts kids first. Teachers deserve a fair and sustainable settlement, and children deserve a world class education.

Wherever I go, I also hear from families and businesses who are struggling thanks to the BC Liberal government's decisions to hike their costs. Hydro rates are rising 28% on top of yet another round of ferry fare and MSP increases. Families deserve a break, and my colleagues and I will continue to hold the government accountable for these harmful choices.

Another significant concern I have heard has arisen from the recent federal decision to approve the Enbridge pipeline. This is a bad decision for British Columbians who believe, as I do, that BC needs to create more jobs through resource development that benefits our communities and protects our land, air and water.

Unlike the Premier, my colleagues and I have consistently opposed the plan to transport Alberta bitumen to tankers on BC's north coast. The federal government's decision to green-light the Enbridge pipeline

puts BC jobs and BC's natural beauty at enormous risk for very little benefit.

The drawbacks of the Enbridge project stand in stark contrast to a made-in-BC opportunity for liquefied natural gas (LNG) exports. If managed properly, with protection of our land, air and water, LNG exports will create good new jobs in BC, respect and include First Nations and benefit BC communities.

But, the BC Liberal government is putting this opportunity at risk by mismanaging the file. The Premier is jeopardizing key partnerships with First Nations, and her proposed tax framework will come a year too late. Her government is not working effectively to gain social license for LNG exports. She's refused to conduct a scientific review of fracking, lead an honest public discussion about her government's greenhouse gas targets, or take action to mitigate risks to our natural environment.

The BC Liberal government's failures on Enbridge and LNG are hurting investors, First Nations and the public's confidence in the economy, and are harming BC's ability

to create more jobs through resource development.

Lastly, I want to highlight my ongoing concern that this government is failing to meet the standards of integrity expected by British Columbians. Recently, my colleague, David Eby, exposed that Advanced Education Minister Amrik Virk, a former RCMP officer, broke the rules governing salaries at public universities at least twice when he was chair of Kwantlen Polytechnic University's human resources committee. Mr. Virk approved a \$50,000 contract without any deliverables and then did not properly disclose it to government.

Mr. Virk cannot now be the minister responsible for ensuring others follow those same rules. Yet, despite claiming "I will always strive to maintain the highest standard of integrity," the Premier has not only failed to remove the Minister, she says he has her "absolute confidence." The BC Liberal government's lack of accountability continues to astound!

As your MLA and the Leader of the Official Opposition, I will continue to push the government on these and many, many more issues.
